ADJOURNED REGULAR MEETING OF THE COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS PARTNERSHIP COUNTY OF PLUMAS, STATE OF CALIFORNIA HELD IN QUINCY ON NOVEMBER 16, 2022

STANDING ORDERS

Due to the Coronavirus disease (COVID-19) Public Health Emergency, dated March 16, 2020, the County of Plumas is making several changes related to Board of Supervisors meetings to protect the public's health and prevent the disease from spreading locally.

The Plumas County Health Officer Recommendation Regarding Teleconferencing, issued on September 30, 2021, recommends local legislative bodies, such as commissions, committees, boards, and councils, hold public meetings with teleconferencing as authorized by Government Code section 54953 (e).

Due to Government Code section 54953(e), the Boardroom will be open to the public but subject to state or federal social distancing or masking requirements, if applicable. Deborah Norrie requests that line in October 19, 2022 minutes regarding bureaucratic breadcrumb trail be stricken from the minutes, only that pretrial should be removed from CCP as it is no longer under CCP.

B. REVIEW THE CCP PLAN AND SURVEYS A & B, PREPARE FOR SUBMISSION;
DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION

Chief Allred outlines changes to plan, reminds executive committee of the looming deadline for submission. Chief discusses changes to page seven, striking lines on a table that may not be accurate. Chief notes that changes were largely made by Probation and the Alternative Sentencing Program (ASP), and not much else.

District Attorney David Hollister requests time to comment, outlines two primary things: First, improving the plan next year to share more common goals, pooling resources and working towards those goals. Second, discussion on certain items that were discussed earlier. DA laments the county being at the whim of private enterprise when it comes to housing. DA also expresses concern about inaccurate statistics, which could cause issues with SB678 funding, as it is based on recidivism rates. DA also expresses the need to pool resources to improve things. DA thanks Chief for opportunity to comment.

Chief Allred has no comment, but outlines that reentry shouldn't be difficult to combine into a single track, programming and curriculum aside.

DA expresses dissatisfaction with table on page seven, mentions example of inconsistency.

Discussion between Chief and DA is had regarding the matter. DA mentions he has to leave soon, but would like to meet to discuss SB678, which hasn't happen since Dan Prince was Chief. Chief Allred agrees, schedules SB678 discussion for next CCP meeting. DA leaves phone call.

Craig Osborne inquires about data source, Chief Allred states it is Probation's caseload software, Enterprise, which tracks the data. Further discussion is had regarding the data collection process. Chief Allred ultimately strikes the table from the CCP Plan draft, requests motion to amend plan.

Motion: Approve the CCP Plan and Surveys A & B, excluding table from page 7, and striking Pretrial Services mentions on page 9 **Action:** Approve, **Moved by** Todd Johns, **Seconded by** Craig Osborne.

Vote: Motion by split vote (**summary:** Yes = 5 No = 0 Absent = 1).
