- i. Kevin Lynch presents a preliminary outline and the report that outlines Plumas County Probation's 2023-2024 Consolidated Juvenile Justice plan and strategy.
- ii. The presentation is a preliminary version of the report which includes an explanation/background on the Juvenile Justice Grant; Plumas County Demographics, comparative unemployment rates (Plumas County/California/Nation Wide) between 2016 and 2021; Rate of Opioid Related Deaths (Plumas County/California) between 2006 and 2021; Rate of Opioid Prescriptions (Plumas County/California) between 2008 and 2021; Rate of Domestic Violence Calls for Service (Plumas County/California) between 2006 and 2020; Rate of Substantiated Child Abuse Cases (Plumas County/California) between 2016 and 2021; Rate of Children in Foster Care (Plumas County/California) between 2016-2022; bar graph that shows Plumas County 11th grade report between 2017 and 2019 reporting higher rates of alcohol, marijuana, vaping consumption and truancy versus the California average; declining juvenile arrests in California; number of arrests of juveniles 2011-2021 (Total Juvenile Arrests, Felony Arrests, Misdemeanor Arrests and Status Offender Arrests); Total number of Referrals to Probation/Juvenile Division 2019-2021; Distribution of Offenses 2019-2021.

QUESTIONS REGARDING THE PRESENTATION

- b. Bill Powers asked whether one of the demographics addressed is family issues as he is seeing it in Portola as a very important issue.
 - c. Kevin Lynch: Stated Family Dynamics is usually one of the big factors in Juvenile Justice. After he is able to assess the data, we will see if Family Dynamics is a major factor in Plumas County.
 - d. Danielle Blust: Asked if the Adverse Childhood Experiences study is being considered.
 - e. Kevin Lynch: Children with adverse experiences are more involved in substance abuse and the juvenile justice system. He received ACE's information from Probation that he will attempt to incorporate.
 - f. Danielle Blust: Asked about the WestEd School Survey information page, stating it was from 2017 and she did not believe that it included Greenville?
 - g. Kevin Lynch: Stated he was going to inquire about more current data and would possibly leave it out.
 - h. Keevin Allred: One of the challenges is the low numbers in Plumas County as the data can be skewed by one or two occurrences.
 - i. Keevin Allred: Asked if there were any other questions of comments and if the committee was comfortable with moving forward with the meeting.
 - j. All were comfortable with moving forward.
 - k. Keevin Allred thanked Kevin Lynch for his presentation.
 - l. Keevin Allred: Asked group if, based upon our review of Phase One today, the committee is ready and willing to move to Phase two, stakeholder interviews?
 - m. Sharon Sousa recommended to move to Phase Two.
 - i. **MOTION:** Proceed to Phase Two of the JJCC Consolidated Plan process with Kevin Lynch **ACTION:** Approve **MOTION PASSES UNANIMOUSLY.**
 - n. Keevin Allred: Kevin Lynch to interview people in the community regarding the subject. Possible interviews could include stakeholders such as the DA, Behavioral Health staff, Sheriff's Office staff, judges, etc. Stated he could not guarantee who would be interviewed; however, if anyone had suggestions he would try to get them added to the list.
 - o. Bill Powers suggested updating/interviewing Plumas Unified School District Superintendent William Roderick since PUSD staff have been unable to attend recent meetings.
 - p. Keevin Allred agreed that the Superintendent was a good choice.
 - q. Keevin Allred suggested the following schedule:
 - i. Next Meeting March 1, 2023 to review the first draft of the report as receipt is due that day.
 - ii. April 5, 2023: Follow up meeting prior to the Board of Supervisor Presentation to approve final draft.
 - iii. April 12 or April 19, 2023: presentation to the Board of Supervisors.
 - iv. May 1, 2023: Submission of Plan
 - r. Schedule approved. Behavioral Health to send an alternate.
